Comments from the Chair

Mary Beth thought the three weeks of ads in the Northern Virginia Daily was a great campaign and hoped businesses that participated benefited from this. Mary Beth also mentioned the availability of another Covid-related grant initiative, Round 3 – Shenandoah County Small Business Covid-19 Recovery Assistance Grant. She noted that if a business had received a grant via a prior round of Shenandoah Recovery Assistance Grants, it would not be eligible for Round 3.
